Background

South Australian state government has introduced new laws for the compulsory desexing and microchipping of cats and dogs

1ST JULY 2018

All dogs and cats must be microchipped by three months of age.

All dogs and cats born after this date must be desexed (Exemptions apply for owners of working dogs and registered breeders).

Anyone who breeds dogs and/or cats for sale must register with The Dog and Cat Management Board (DCMB) as a breeder.






Do you own cat or dog?






Where did you get your cat from?





Does your cat go outside?



















Should the council use laws to manage roaming cats?





Should the council use laws to manage roaming cats vs is there a change in roaming cats in last 5 years?









Summary

Support for desexing, microchipping and registration of cats, regardless of ownership status

Microchipping

More cat owners than non-owners supported
Benefits of chipping
Seen as the best way to identify cats
Increase change of return

Collars

Non-cat owners more likely to support collars

Impression that this is a good way of identifying cats
